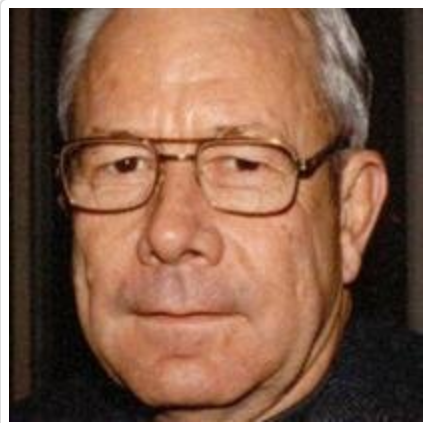




Francis Dale Strowmatt

F. Dale Strowmatt, 83, of Morton, IL died Monday, Dec. 5, 2011 at the Methodist Medical Center in Peoria. He was born Sept. 20, 1928 in Roodhouse, the son of Clyde James and Hazel Henrietta Hart Strowmatt.

Surviving are his children, Becky (Gary) Bloom of Pekin and Kevin Strowmatt of Mountain Home AR; six grandchildren, Jennifer and Nick Bloom; Ashley, Casey, McKenzie, and Alexia Strowmatt; several great grandchildren; and one brother, Gary, (Cheryl) Strowmatt of Worden. Two brothers, Darrell and C. Ralph Strowmatt, preceded him in death.

Dale worked at Caterpillar Tractor Company in Peoria, retiring in Aug. 1982 from building KK. He was an Army veteran of the Korean War, earning the rank of Sergeant 1st class. He served eleven months on the front line. He received several medals, including a distinguished service medal cross, Good Conduct, National Defense, and the President of Korea valor medal. He was also awarded medals for service and defense of the principals of the Charter of the United Nations and Korea Service.

He was a wonderful father who selflessly raised his daughter and son by himself. He placed the needs of his children before his own. The light of his life was his grandchildren. His warmth and soft-spoken ways will continue to enrich his family's lives beyond his time on earth. He will be greatly missed by

his children and grandchildren.
