After retiring from teaching, she worked as a secretary for the Jacksonville Public School Foundation, the Jacksonville School District in the Early Years Program and then, in the District's Curriculum Office. Nancy learned to play piano as a youngster and played at some weddings. She loved to sing and was an excellent painter in watercolor and oils. Nancy enjoyed cooking from the time she was in 4-H. After her retirement, she began sewing and making quilts. Nancy was a caring person who helped others, many times anonymously, and was proud of her nieces and nephews. She had a special place in her heart for her cats.
