These talents led to jobs as secretary to Ralph Witthe, Ivan Garrison, the Bluffs School system and lastly the Bluffs Times newspaper office, for Dallas and Elaine Warrum.

Near and dear to her heart was the Bluffs Baptist Church where she taught the beginner's Sunday School class and Vacation Bible School. Her lessons often included a flannel graph board and figures. When Bess Bruce began "Mission Friends" on Wednesday evenings, Doris provided the crafts that went with the lessons. She would spend hours preparing crafts for the kids.

Always wanting to keep busy, Doris was a talented baker, seamstress, knitter and crafter.

She could hold a conversation while knitting and “never drop a stitch”. Her Christmas candies, Red Velvet cake and apple danish were famous throughout the family.

Having survived breast cancer, she knew the importance of support during and after treatment. She would send cards of encouragement to others that were fighting the same battle. Especially close to her were friends Debbie Rose, Alexa Rogers and the late Pam Davis.

A funeral service will be held 10:00 a.m. Thursday, June 2, 2022, at the Daws Family Funeral Home in Jacksonville with interment in Hillcrest Cemetery near Bluffs.
