Harold E. Pence, 88, of Winchester passed away Thursday, Apr. 16, 2020, at his residence. He was born, Apr. 29, 1931, the second son of Jesse A. and Anna L. Wright Pence. He married, Wanda Jean Evans, May 29, 1955. They would have celebrated 65 years of marriage in May.

Surviving is wife, Wanda Pence of Winchester; daughter, Shirley Ehlert; grandchildren, Sarah Ehlert and Tim McClenning; his pride and joy, Huntley Ann Ehlert, a great granddaughter; brother, Donald (Shelby) Pence of Murrayville and several nieces and nephews. Harold served his country with the Army during the Korean Conflict.
