Maurice Clyde Funk, 92, of Jacksonville and formerly of Scott County died Wednesday, July 7, 2010 at his home in Jacksonville. He was born Oct. 14, 1917 in Bluffs, the son of Clyde and Eva Hutches Funk. He married Ruby E. Springer Jan. 29, 1949. She preceded him in death.

One nephew-in-law, Bob Carter of Mexico, MO, survives him. Preceding him in death were his parents and sister, Marie Schuling.

Maurice was a farmer in Scott County and worked as a letter carrier for the U.S. Postal Service for twenty years in Winchester. During WWII he served in the U.S. Army in the South Pacific. He was a Mason, a lifetime member of the American Legion Post #442, Veterans of Foreign Wars Post #1379, and Loyal order of Moose Post #865. He enjoyed playing golf. He was a very benevolent person.
