He loved his children and was so proud of all of them, and his grandchildren as well. He had little stories he would tell about each of them. He knew his children, their character, their strengths, their weaknesses and he loved them so very much.

One thing about Bobby,

if he ever loved you, I don't think he ever stopped loving you. He was that kind of guy. He might let you know what was not gonna work and how he was gonna handle it, or how he felt ...but he was still gonna love you and you might not hear those exact words but you knew.
